"Complexus" is aimed at promoting the sense of belonging to the local, national and European community, by strengthening knowledge and awareness, in the generation of "European natives". The partners intend to strengthen the work on the competences of citizenship, in an international dimension that wants to promote the founding values of the European Union



About the project:

- The aim of the project is to re-create among the partners' schools a **EU School Parliament** with its committees: in this way pupils will truly understand by acting directly the whole process of representative democracy
- The schools will represent an international body, able to cooperate and work together (with new digital technologies support) on different and vital issues. Each committee will be transnational: the mobility will be the moment in which students (elected in their own school), coming from the countries involved, will act as "experts" on the chosen topic. Once back, they will transfer to their mates and the all institute practices and ideas born and shared during the mobility activity. These situations will be the opportunity to work with competence-based methodology (and in particular on Training Learning Approach).
- The main topics of the project are: **DEMOCRACY**, **CULTURE**, **HUMAN RIGHTS AND ANTI-DISCRIMINATION**, **ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY**, **ECO-TOURISM**.
- The main goal of the project is the pupils' acquisition of:
 - social-civic and citizenship skills
 - skills in communication in foreign languages and in digital media
 - spirit of initiative and entrepreneurship
 - cultural awareness and expression.

O. TEACHERS' TRAINING

1ST MEETING IN ISEO (ITALY):28,29,30 OCTOBER 2019

MAIN POINTS OF FOCUS:

- -TLA METHOD: The Italian staff, experienced in competency-based learning, will illustrate in details the TLA (Teaching-Learning Activities, Laurillard, 2012) methodology in order to give the same coaching tools to all teachers. The method, brilliantly implemented at the Iseo school for the last five years, is founded on teaching as a "design science": pupils learn better through mobile and microlearning approach based on concrete issues, episodes related to the reality. The activities' project will follow this pedagogical methodology:
- Elaboration of a format which, starting from the key European competences, defines the dimensions of transversal competence to promote and declare the concrete actions to be carried out to solve a real problem, felt by the students as a social problem
- Elaboration of evaluation grids for each issue (=Committee) of active citizenship that focus on the levels of competence in the acquisition of transversal competences
- -COMMITEE SESSIONS: The activities will focus in developing a well-functioning working method to be applied to the Committee Sessions. The teachers involved will develop a step by step process that will set out guidelines for:
- Elections of pupils
- Management and coordination of Committee Activities (E-TWINNING)
- -DISSEMINATION: sharing the plan, actions to be done in order to disseminate the project



1. TOURISM COMMITTEE

Italy, 2-7 March 2020

Participants: 6 pupils for each school, aged11/12 + 2 teachers per school

The mobility will focus on: how to **promote tourism**? How citizens can give more **value** to the **local sites** of interest? What is **sustainable tourism**?

The proposed activities and visits are aimed to promote sustainable tourism while getting to know local sites and local history. During these visits pupils will be the tourist guide of other pupils.

Output of the mobility: creation of **e-Mini-guidebooks** that will be later shared in each school, in digital format, in order to:

- promote the **culture of sustainability** in tourism activities, seen as an opportunity to benefit from their own cultural and natural heritage
- develop of self-awareness and long-term thinking in ecology issues
- explore **digitalisation**: most natural, cultural and historical heritage are not digitalized and this restrains the access of the general public and tourists



2. CULTURAL COMMITTEE

Poland, 10-16 May 2020

Participants: 6 pupils for each school (Italy: 9), aged11/12 + 2 teachers per school

The mobility will focus on: Which **traditions** are peculiars of each country involved? Are there any **common elements**? Is it recognized an **EU cultural identity**?

The aim of the mobility is to **explore and compare** national culture and traditions through music and dances, whereas performing arts will be the instrument to promote and develop **EU values** of tolerance, broadmindedness and solidarity.

Output of the mobility: composition and shooting of a **musical** built on different tradition mashed-up. Music, dances and popular traditions will recall national cultural roots, re-establishing the awareness of national cultural dimensions and will reinforce a common European identity.

This activity aims to improve pupils' **dynamism**, **understanding of each other and mutual acceptance**.



3. HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE

Serbia ...days.. October 2020

Participants: 6 pupils for each school (Italy: 9), aged11/12 + 2 teachers per school

The mobility will focus on: what are **human rights** and why is their protection so **important** for EU? What can citizens do to make them **respect**ed? What can the education system do towards the **youngest generations**?

The activity aims at raising the voice against discrimination and violation of Human Rights, by enhancing the knowledge of citizenship fundamentals by giving students tools to act.

Output of the mobility: **interviews and shoot self-made videos and ads** that promotes anti-bullying behaviors. There will be held workshops in order to train pupils to:

- understand the necessity of a rule that regulates community life and, through negotiation, actively contribute to respecting or changing rules according to needs
- recognize children's rights and to be able to participate actively in their realization
- develop moral reasoning and cultivating basic human values
- actively contribute to the development of a child-friendly school
- develop awareness of the need to respect diversity and personality, to identify and overcome stereotypes related to gender, age, appearance, behavior, origin
- train students for nonviolent conflict resolution



4. DEVELOPMENT AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE

Italy/Spain ...days... March 2021

Participants: 6 pupils for each school (Italy: 9), aged11/12 + 2 teachers per school

The activity will focus on the **sustainable development goals** from the UN Agenda 2030. What are environmental problems and why is the environment protection so important for EU? What should citizens do to increase the environment protection? What can the education system do towards the youngest generations?

The aim is to improve both awareness of climate changing and scientific understanding of all the consequences related and to increase the culture of sustainability. A specific attention will be reserved to water: the importance of water as a source of life, the shortage of water we are facing and the consumption of water.

Before the exchange, pupils will be asked to keep a diary monitoring their using of water, during the mobility kids will compare usage and will discuss about it.

Output of the project: **Kids'Guide to Save the World**, founded on the "what I can do?" question, pupils will shape and map out little steps everyone can do in order to improve the environment.
